

# ***May 2019- Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report***

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 115 incidents for the month of May 2019, compared to 70 incidents in May 2018. Firefighters have responded to 500 incidents so far this year.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 231.36 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 247.31 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 478.67 hours responding to incidents in May 2019.
- Personnel spent 27 hours attending meetings and 169 hours in training sessions during the month of May 2019.
- Members spent 352 hours participating in the FD Fundraiser. The annual event was a success, with approximately 1,400 plates served and approximately \$20,000 raised to purchase equipment.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 3797.23 hours since January 1, 2019 responding to incidents, attending meetings, attending training sessions and participating in extra activities.
