

# ***April 2017- Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report***

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 81 incidents for the month of April 2017, compared to 74 incidents in April 2016.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 123.62 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 149.71 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 273.33 hours responding to incidents in April 2017.
- Personnel spent 35 hours attending meetings and 57.25 hours in training sessions during the month of April 2017.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 2359.95 hours since January 1, 2017 responding to incidents, attending meetings, and participating in training sessions.
