

June 2017- Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 88 incidents for the month of June 2017, compared to 61 incidents in June 2016.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 181.89 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 119.55 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 301.44 hours responding to incidents in June 2017.
- Personnel spent 28 hours attending meetings and 64 hours in training sessions during the month of June 2017.
- Members spent 30 hours participating in the Berges Fest Parade.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 3598.92 hours since January 1, 2017 responding to incidents, attending meetings, and participating in training sessions.
