

September 2017- Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 77 incidents for the month of September 2017, compared to 72 incidents in September 2016. Personnel have responded to a total of 706 incidents for the year so far.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 151.88 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 85.55 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 234.43 hours responding to incidents in September 2017.
- Personnel spent 33 hours attending meetings and 78.5 hours in training sessions during the month of September 2017. Personnel also spent 36 hours participating in the Kendall County Fair Parade.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 4836.68 hours since January 1, 2017 responding to incidents, attending meetings, and participating in training sessions.
