

March 2018- Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 80 incidents for the month of March 2018, compared to 69 incidents in March 2017.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 125.58 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 222.58 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 348.16 hours responding to incidents in March 2018.
- Personnel spent 44 hours attending meetings and 162.25 hours in training sessions during the month of March 2018.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 1738.98 hours since January 1, 2018 responding to incidents, attending meetings, and participating in training sessions.
